TONIGHT'S Matchup

Hello basketball fans, and welcome to another exciting season of Neenah Rocket basketball. After the completion of the 2023-24 season which saw the Rockets finish with an overall record of 21-8 (victorious in 17 out of their final 19 basketball games), finish 13-5 (second place) in the FVA, earn their 30th trip to the WIAA boys state basketball tournament (most in Wisconsin state history), and finish the season playing in the state semifinals on the floor of the Kohl Center, the Rocket Game Day is excited for the start of the 2024-25 Neenah basketball season.

The mission of this game day program remains the same. It is to provide you, the fan, with as much information as possible regarding tonight's game, as well as other pertinent information involving the history of the Neenah boys' basketball program. Therefore, we hope you enjoy the pregame reading material as well as watching another thrilling season of Neenah Rocket basketball. Our one request to the basketball fans, please let's provide the positive support and encouragement to the young men and Neenah Rocket coaching staff that will represent both our school district and community of Neenah for the next four months. Please consider bringing some friends or family members to a game this year. High school basketball might be the last pure basketball left in our country. The NBA has multi-millionaires that can't play multiple games in a week because of "load management." Money has ruined college basketball to the point that we now have boosters paying hundreds of thousands of dollars a year to rent a player for five months inside the NCAA transfer portal. The Rockets compete in one of the best conferences in the state, and Coach Rabas has again put together a non-conference schedule that is as tough as you will find.

After tonight's battle with the Papermakers, the Rockets will play five games before the close of the 2024 calendar year. Next Friday the Rockets will travel to Fond du Lac to face the Cardinals. On Tuesday, December 17, Neenah will host Kaukauna and it will also be Neenah middle school basketball night. Three days later the Rockets will travel to Appleton East to take on the Patriots. On Saturday, December 21, Neenah will host Kenosha Indian Trail in a non-conference game. That night will also be our annual Neenah basketball alumni night. One week later, the Rockets will travel to UW-River Falls to play Hudson.

Coach Lee Rabas is beginning his 10th season as head coach of the Rocket basketball program and is looking at replacing three seniors that graduated from last year's sectional championship team. However, if there is one thing we have learned during Coach Rabas' tenure at Neenah, the Rockets don't rebuild, they just reload. This season's varsity roster is made up of seven seniors and nine underclassmen. The Rockets will be attempting to win their 16th FVA title, which would also be their 32nd conference title in program history.

The Rockets enter tonight's battle with the Papermakers 0-1 on the young season. Last Wednesday afternoon the Rockets opened the 2024-25 season by losing to non-conference rival Brookfield East 56-46 in a game where Neenah shot poorly from the field and turned the basketball over too many times.

Tonight, the Rockets roll out the welcome mat for head coach Freddie Owens and his Kimberly Papermakers. Coach Owens was a two-year starter and four-year letter winner at Wisconsin, where he was co-captain of the Badgers' 2002 and 2003 Big Ten regular-season and 2004 Big Ten Tournament championship teams. For the past 18 years, he coached at the college level for various programs including the University of Wisconsin, UWGB, Oregon State, and College of the Holy Cross.

Coach Owens brings a team to Neenah that graduated three seniors from last year's Paper-maker squad that finished 17-9. As usual, Kimberly will be athletic, physically strong, deep and have no shortage of size (eight players at least 6'3" or taller). The Papermakers lost their season opening game earlier this week in overtime in Stevens Point by the score of 72-63.

- ◆ The longest Neenah regular season win streak in the series is 7 games (1977-1980 and 1997-2000).
- ◆ The longest Kimberly regular season win streak in the series is 7 games (1963-1966).
- Neenah's largest margin of victory (30 points) was in 1992 by the score of 68-38.
- ◆ Neenah's largest margin of defeat (30 points) was in 1956 by the score of 84-54.
- In the 151 total games that Neenah & Damp; Kimberly have played since 1933, only 7 games have gone to overtime. Four of them happened in consecutive years between 2001-2004.
- Neenah and Kimberly dominated the FVA in the 1970's. Kimberly won the title in 1972, 1973, 1974. Neenah won the title in 1971, 1975, 1976, 1978, and 1979. Both Neenah and Kimberly tied for the FVA crown in 1977.
- Kimberly has second-highest winning percentage in the 55-year history of the FVA at .614, trailing only Neenah at .658. These are the only two schools that own a winning percentage over .600 in FVA league play.
